Born in Hyderabad, Sultana Hasan lives and works in Bangalore. She received her degree in graphic arts from “L’Ecole Nationale Superieure des Arts Appliqués et des Métiers d’Arts” (Paris) and MA in painting (arts plastiques) from Ecole National Superieure des BEAUX ARTS, Paris. She studied printmaking at the John Cass College of Art, London, London College of Printmaking, London (U.K.) and the Museum School of Fine Art, Boston (U.S.A.). She has worked as an illustrator in advertising agencies in Paris and publishing houses in Paris and India.

Sultana has held solo and group exhibitions in India and abroad. Her works are in collections in Canada, France, Germany, India, Indonesia, Hong Kong, Muscat, Switzerland, U.K. and U.S.A.

Sultana has explored different techniques ranging from oil, watercolour, pastel, acrylic, printmaking and collage. Her themes have often revolved around the human face, where she has integrated paper and fabric into her collage paintings. Her works have also portrayed the human form in her series of nudes, market vendors, landscapes and workers at construction sites, especially women. Lately, she has been exploring nature’s survival in its conflict with man.
